

As I write this, the legislative session is coming to an end and VVH's budget took a few hits. The Legislature cut \$259,000 from our overtime budget and \$41,000 from our prescription drug budget. With one week left in the session we are not sure if these cuts will remain. I will be spending the last week of the session in Montpelier to continue to educate the Legislators on the impact of these cuts.
