February has been a month of legislative visits. Al and I attended the National Association of State Veterans Homes Winter Conference in Washington D.C. this month. We met with representatives from our federal delegation and provided them with an update on the Home. During the first day of the conference, VA Secretary Robert Wilkie spoke to the group. He expressed support for the State Veterans Home program and is looking for ways for us to have a stronger partnership.

After returning from DC, our next stop was Montpelier to provide budget testimony to the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, the House Committee on General, Housing, and Military Affairs and Senate Institutions. We also had the opportunity to meet briefly with the Governor during his weekly coffee hour. We were able to provide him with an update on the activities of the Home and to thank him for his continuing support. We will not know the final decision regarding our operating and capital budget requests until the end of March. It is never too late to contact your local legislator and express your support for the Home.

Chaplain's Corner

Howdy Folks,

I want to share with you a wonderful experience Elaine and I had recently at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery near Washington DC.

Our American Legion Commander Department of Vermont, David Woodward, arranged for the Department to lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier on 25 February 2019. He invited members and spouses to go as well.

Nine of us arrived at the amphitheater just before 4 p.m. right after the changing of the Guard. Elaine and I were the last to climb the stairs as we were slower than the rest. We were about 60 or 70 feet from the others when the wreath laying ceremony was about to start.

Commander Woodward walked over to me and said, "Ken, come with me to lay the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier." I was flabbergasted, but he did not give me a chance to think about it. Then he said "Come, we need to get instructions from the Host" (a member of the Old Guard). We went to the top of the stairs where the Host gave us specific instructions, then we marched down the stairs in unison to a spot about 10 feet from the wreath tripod. Another Host handed us the wreath and we walked forward and placed the wreath, stood back and hand saluted while Taps was played. We then returned to the top of the stairs where the Host told us we done good. It was over.

Needless to say, this was the most emotional and exhilarating experience I have ever endured. Holy Moly, I just shared in laying a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. It was awesome.

The entire amphitheater was stone silent during the wreath laying ceremony. It is hard to describe the emotions that permeated my head. I will never forget those few seconds in front of the Tomb. I thought of all my fellow Veterans here at the Vermont Veterans' Home and wished each one of you could experience this event.

We all need to remember that these Unknowns, the 400,000 laid to rest here at Arlington National Cemetery and the 1.3 million active duty members now serving are the reason we enjoy our freedoms.

Let us pray we will never forget the sacrifices they made and are making so we can enjoy our everyday choices.



Pray that those who were stricken and are now sick with the flu are soon all well again.

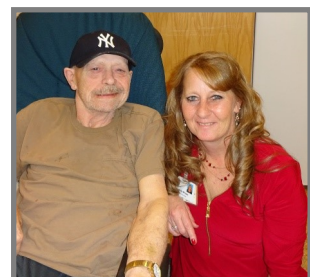
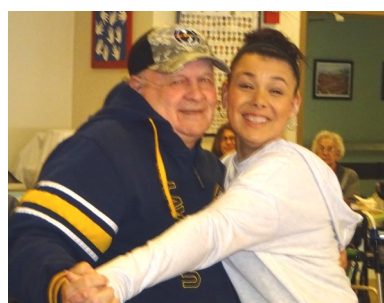
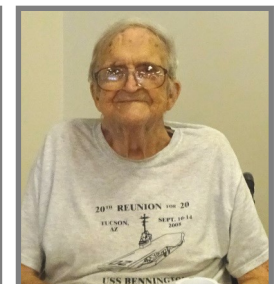


Louise Gauthier gives an organ recital for the residents on Cardinal Point. She is well known for her musical talent as an organist for many, many years at a local Catholic Church.

Our Plan is composed of: Mission Statement, Statement of Purpose, Guiding Principles, QAPI Goals, QAPI Scope, Guidelines for Governance & Leadership, Feedback Data Systems and Monitoring and Guidelines for Performance Improvement Project (PIP) teams.

Each time there is a QAPI Corner, I will discuss an area of our QAPI Plan.

We will start with our **Mission Statement:**

The Vermont Veterans' Home provides best of class healthcare services to Veterans, their spouses and Gold Star parents while honoring their choices and respecting their right of self-determination.

Every day our staff honors the Veteran or Member choices by asking them what they want to do, what they want to eat and much more. We encourage the Veterans/Members to be a vocal part of the healthcare team and tell us what is important to them. We try to provide the best of class healthcare services and we are judged by two different agencies to ensure we are providing the very best care. Both the Veterans Administration (VA) and Licensing & Protection conduct annual surveys and those findings are used with other factors in Nursing Home Compare. We are a 5-Star facility which is the highest rating a nursing home can achieve. We are always trying to improve and that is what QAPI is about: looking at our processes and systems and analyzing what improvements we can make.

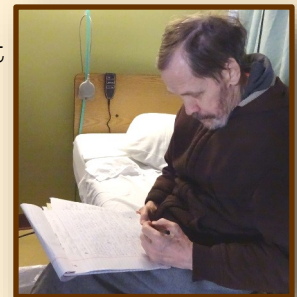

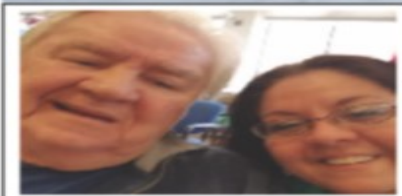
SOCIAL SERVICES & CASE MANAGERS DEPARTMENTS
