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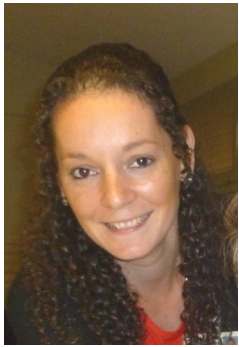
From the Administrator... Melissa Jackson

It's hard to believe that the flu season will soon be here for the 2019-2020 season. The more residents and staff that receive the influenza vaccine the more protection we will all have.

Many of our Veterans and Members are very compromised with major health issues and their immune system simply cannot fight off the flu.

Vaccines help our bodies develop immunity by imitating an infection. The “inactivated” vaccine that we receive DOES NOT CAUSE THE FLU, instead it produces antibodies in your body. The body is left with a supply of “memory” and the antibodies remember how to fight the disease in the future. Antibodies sound a red alert when they identify bad germs.

Also, it is no longer the case that if you have an egg allergy you should not receive the flu vaccine. The FDA has approved a new way of making the flu vaccine that does not use eggs. CDC recommends that you receive the flu vaccine by the end of October, however, getting the vaccine after would also be beneficial.

Let's all work together for this year's flu campaign to keep everyone healthy at VVH!!

CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

Dear VVH Friends,

Autumn is that great season of change between the warmth and sunshine of summer and the crisp, cold, snow- filled days of winter. Isaiah 40:8 remind us that-

"The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever"



In a changeable world, in a world of uncertainty, what a great assurance it is that we have something we can rely on and that is God's Word. We hear so often that life is uncertain. We look around us and we see challenges on every side. This is certainly not something that afflicts our present age alone. Holy Scripture assures us that the God we serve is one who never changes and whose love is forever secure, in each and every age.

The 1930's were another time of great challenge in our nation and the world at large. Many of assurances then held were in questions. Old alliances were shaken. As we know the world stood on the edge of the greatest conflict in human history. The Great Depression devastated nations as well as individuals.

It was in this decade of uncertainty [the 1930's] that one churchman conceived of the idea of "World-wide Communion Sunday," [now commonly known as "World Communion Sunday."] He felt it important for churches to set aside one Sunday a year to celebrate together their common faith. This movement to create a World Communion Sunday grew out of a division between two churches. It was felt that by focusing on what unites us rather than what divides us, that churches could come together in the spirit of unity.

On October 7, congregations around the globe will celebrate World Communion Sunday. They will be reaffirming their commitment to the Lord and to each other as well. As one contemporary chorus expresses it "*we are one in the Spirit.*"

World Communion Sunday remind us that when we gather together we do so as a family. And just as a family gathers at the table for various celebrations, so we as a family of faith gather as well. We witness to the fact that there is so much more that unites us than that which divides us and if we can keep our focus on that simple fact, things can and will change. Not only will they change, they will change for the better!

The Psalmist tells us in Psalm 133-

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity...for there the LORD bestows his blessing, even life forevermore."

You see... unity is not uniformity. Unity is a condition of the spirit, uniformity is often impressed from the outside.

John Wesley expressed this so very well when he wrote, "*Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may. Herein all the children of God may unite, notwithstanding these smaller differences.*"

In our sadly divided world, wouldn't this be a powerful witness to the love of God for everyone? In ways great and small, may we pledge ourselves anew to the challenge of unity. May we pledge ourselves to pray for each other, care for each other, love and encourage each other as well! God's richest blessing to you all.

Our plan is termed an "All Hazards" plan, scalable, and adjustable to respond to the event.

At home, you should all have a basic understanding of how you will respond to an event that cuts off power, water, transportation, and anything else you see as a necessity in your life.

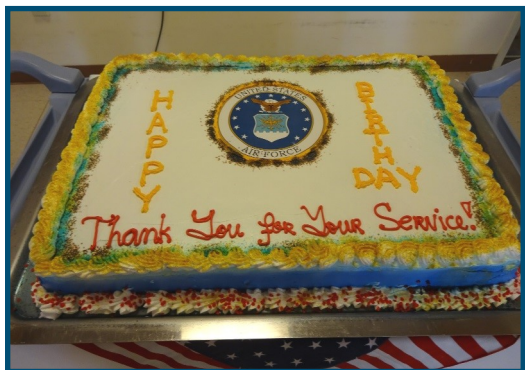
