#### Have you met "The Hug?"

The hug is a sensory device developed for use with people with late-stage dementia. It serves to fulfill a basic need to feel nurtured, allowing the person to give a hug and receive one in return with its soft weighted arms. On the outside it is soft and cuddly and on the inside is an electronic device that simulates a beating heart.

We hope to use the Hug not only for those with dementia, but also for those with anxiety or PTSD and at end of life to help provide comfort.



A former Sergeant in the Marine Corps took a new job as a high school teacher.


