Happy New Year!!

As I celebrate my 14th year at VVH, I am just as excited today as I was on January 3, 2011, when I first started here. 2024 has been an incredible year for VVH. The facility had many achievements in 2024.

We received the America Health Care's Bronze Quality Award. We were recognized by U.S. News and World Report as providing Best in Class Long-Term and Short-Term Care. There is only one other nursing home in the State of Vermont to receive both recognitions.

We graduated 7 LNAs from an LNA class this summer and currently have 5 students in another class that will graduate late winter. Activities Director, Marjorie LaFountain, has brought new life into our Activities Program resulting in more programs that bring the community to VVH to interact with our Veterans and Members as well as getting our Veterans and Members back into the community. Greg Krizan now leads our Maintenance Department and is working hard on many improvement projects and ensuring his department has the supplies and tools they need.

Our A-Wing construction project has been delayed due to the overall cost of the project. We could have decided to scale back the project but that would have resulted in losing the small house, home-like model we want for our new memory care unit. Instead, we are applying for additional VA funding so we can build the project as designed.

I want to thank you for entrusting VVH with your care or the care of your loved one. I appreciate your trust in our staff.


