

Marjorie & Leslie (Activities) and Paul (Dietary) assisted the Ladies of the Auxiliary.












Students from the **LONG TRAIL SCHOOL** paid homage to the Marine Corps Veterans celebrating the 249th birthday of the Corps.

Christmas - the day God was born.


